A Bead of Light Tells Natural Time

The Aquitaine Garden Sundial is an instrument that gives you the current time by casting a bead of light rather than a shadow.

The sundial takes its name from Eleanor of Aquitaine, Queen of England. Eleanor had a portable sundial made for King Henry II who used it to keep track of their love trysts.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1) Hang the sundial from the chain to have the maximum exposure to sunlight.
- 2) Position the sundial to allow sunlight to shine through the hole on the outer ring.
- 3) The bead of light that is cast on the inner ring indicates the hour and the season.
